1. Course I: Gandhian Thought

SELF-STUDY COURSES- 2022-2023

In order to enhance the efficiency of the prospective teachers in the domains of reading, grasping, critical viewing and application for life, the college offers sufficient space for self learning courses. The prospective teachers are expected to choose any course indicated by the college for their self-study and achieve a reasonable acquisition of knowledge and skills.

Course Learning Outcomes

The prospective teacher

- 1. Acquires knowledge on social thinkers
- 2. critically looks at the social structure
- 3. constructs his/her own views and ideas on social reality

The college offers the following self-study courses:

1. Gandhian thought

Duration

The duration of self- study course is 50 hours with a combination of theory and practical. However, the combination of theory and practical shall be decided by the course-coordinator with the approval of the Principal.

Examination and Evaluation

Self-study courses are purely internal and the examination is conducted by the coursecoordinator in consultation with the Principal; the answer scripts are valued by the coursecoordinator. The evaluation consists of internal test (5 marks), assignment (5 marks) and practicum (5 Marks) for 15 marks and a terminal examination for 35 marks.

Awarding Certificate

The students who successfully complete the self-study courses shall be issued certificates by Adarsh Education College Yavatmal .



Guidelines

- Self-study courses are obligatory for the completion of the B.Ed programme.
- The prospective teachers must choose one of the three self-study courses offered by the college.
- The self-study course should be completed in the first year of B.Ed Programme.
- For each self-study course, one faculty is appointed to accompany the students.
- A minimum of two hours is allotted in the regular timetable.
